A: 9 months and 20 days. There were 1,300,000 men ([2 Samuel 24:1-9](#))

A: A sword (1 Chronicles 21:14-17)

Q101: The plans for how God's Temple was to be built were put in David's mind by who?

A: 22,000 oxen and 120,000 sheep were sacrificed by Solomon (1 Kings 8:62-63)
